# INCLINE VILLAGE MAIN STREET/INCLINE TAHOE FOUNDATION BEAUTIFICATION CAMPAIGN SPRING CLEANING IN THE VILLAGE INCLINED TO BLOOM

Incline Village Main Street is a revitalization program under the auspices of IVCBA. The community lacks unifying displays of public beauty. Grassroots efforts by Carolyn Usinger and others in the past have resulted in sowing wildflower seeds and temporary art/landscaping implementations. The goal of the Beautification Campaign is to enhance the downtown commercial areas in our beautiful natural setting known as the Lake Tahoe Basin with a more consistent design beginning with our shopping centers.

- Commit to Defensible Space, residential, commercial and community clean-ups
- Plant native perennials along boulevards;
- Provide pots and planters with annuals in shopping centers
- Encourage larger projects with grants through ITF

# Spring Cleaning in the Village

Goal: Mobilize community to clean up after winter and get ready for summer

- Encourage residents to join Blue Crews or IVEH clean-up crews.
- Encourage residents to join East Shore Clean-up on .
- Encourage businesses and property owners to identify ways to improve their location.

## Inclined to Bloom

Goal: Beautify Incline with flowers/landscaping; encourage merchants and residents to do their own planting. Educate residents on effective gardening techniques.

Strategy: Inclined to Bloom pots and hanging planters to give consistent branding look to retail shopping areas.

- Pots and hanging planters offered to center owners and individual owners for purchase; Does IVCBA purchase ahead of time? Or HSG /Grocery Outlet stock them for individual purchase?
- Offer a standard look for people to adopt, list resources and businesses
- Organize committees at each center to ID a plan
- Community asked to donate through ITF
- Begin planning for large scale pots at intersections

# Strategy: Inclined to Bloom summer workshops

- Offer a series of classes on such topics as pollinator friendly plants, flowers that bloom throughout the summer, landscapes that are functional and water efficient, and how to irrigate during warm months
- Line up experts; find a place to hold workshops

**Strategy:** ID landscaping elements that can create cohesive look to Tahoe Blvd:

Hardscape, protective border, style of pot, planter, hanging basket, soil, perennial flowers or flowering bushes like carpet roses and a means of watering.

NDOT: Get occupancy waiver that allows us to clean and landscape on boulevards

**Strategy:** Highlight individual projects. Offer grants through ITF. Ask local landscapers to donate time and expertise. **Areas that already landscape:**
